

Doc Holliday's 3-piece Yard Gator (#2900)

Doc Holliday Colors: Black DH8, Real Brown DH9, Flaxon Yellow DH16, White DH29, Leaf Green DH31, Cream DH37, Grass Green DH38, Shadow Green DH45, Firewood DH94,
Gloss-It Sp3, Matte Spray SP8,
Wet brush =WB, Highlight =HL, Corner load =CL

1. Base-coat All Black
2. WB all with Real Brown, add Grass Green and WB again. Add Cream and HL the tips of the sharp ridge scales on the back and tailpiece as well as the top edge of the eyelid flowing down the ridgelines of the snout and the edge of the nostrils.
3. CL the bottom edge of all three pieces with Firewood keeping it darker at the bottom and fading up into the body as a border all the way around. CL Shadow Green in the deep crevices between the rows of scales and down the center of the snout and around the bottom of the eye under the eyelid. CL these areas again with Black, only dipping a smaller corner into the Black, so as not to cover all the Shadow Green. Place a thin wash of Firewood on all the areas highlighted with Cream to tint the Cream a slight sandy shade. Tip the points of each ridge scale with a thin wash of Leaf Green, place a little of this green wash also on the back of the eyelid. Place a wash of Black in the nostrils
4. Eyes: Paint a large circle of Flaxon Yellow in the eye to create the iris, leave the corners Black (area that would be the white of the eye on a human). CL the outside edge of the Flaxon circle with Grass Green, after it's dry CL the outside again with a thinner stroke of Black allowing some of the Grass Green to show through. Paint an oblong pupil in the center of the eye with Black. Outline the pupil with a thin line of Flaxon Yellow. Once dry, corner load around the pupil with Firewood. Place a dot of White on the top edge of the black pupil for the highlight.
5. Spray with Matte, once dry, paint Goss-It on the Eyes and slightly on the tips of the ridge scales.
